CLASSROOM EQUIPMENT

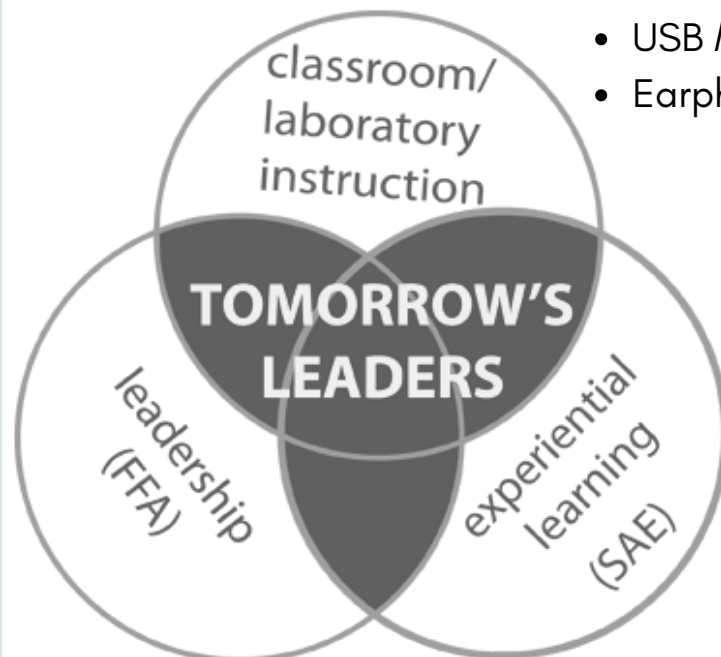
- Our classroom has a chromebook cart that will be utilized often. Please make sure that laptops are in their correct slots and plugged in to charge.
